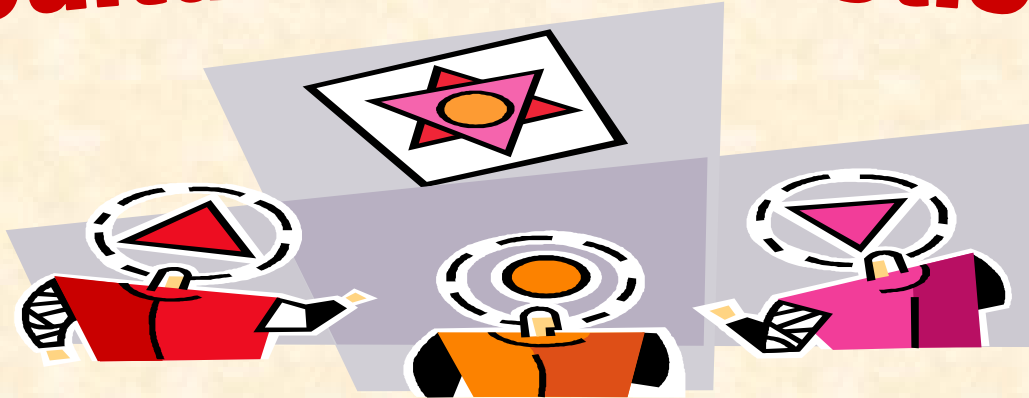

2. **CREATIVE COMMUNICATION:** there are many ways in which we make sense of the world. It is about finding and using creative ways to reflect, explore, ask questions and make sense of what is 'needed in the moment' to have meaningful and productive interactions.
3. **SPONTANEOUS LEADERSHIP:** Choosing to receive, articulate and share the messages of our creativity. It is about taking personal responsibility, daring to move beyond our own perspectives, and seizing the moment to guide people and processes into more inclusive engagements.
